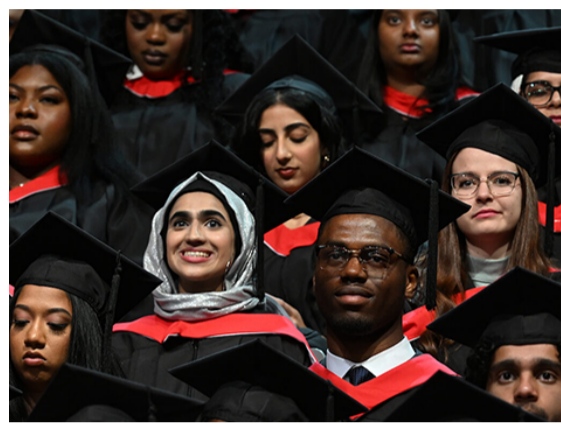
York University marks Pride Month
